Technical Visit to Tai Po Gas Production Plant The Hong Kong and China Gas Company Ltd

Date, Time & Venue

Friday, 29 January, 2010 14:30 to 17:00

Assemble at the Main Entrance, Tai Po Gas Production Plant, Dai Fat Street, Tai Po Industrial Estate, New Territories.

Programme Highlights

Nowadays, the Tai Po Gas Production Plant produces 95% of town gas in Hong Kong, with the remaining gas coming from the Ma Tau Kok Plant. The Tai Po plant, covers an area of 11.71 hectares, commenced operation in 1986. Its maximum production capacity is 9.6 million cubic meter of gas per day through 8 gas making trains.

To commit the environmental policy, town gas is now made from high quality naphtha instead of heavy fuel oil, which reduces the emission of sulphur oxide during production. In 2006, Towngas introduced natural gas as a partial feedstock replacement for naphtha.

The program begins with an overview of fire fighting provisions and the fire safety management plan in the plant to mitigate the risks during operation. Afterward is a guided site tour on the fire fighting facilities for the naphtha tank farm and natural gas facilities.
