- Safety by Design: Actively supporting the development of safety by design in Hong Kong through joint seminars and participation in specialized Master Classes.
- Design for Safety Excellence Award: Promoting this flagship award to a wider audience to recognize innovation and encourage the industry to prioritize safety at the earliest stages of engineering.

While we celebrate the milestones of the previous term, we remain mindful of the challenges that lie ahead. As professional engineers, our obligation to improve industry standards is constant. We will continue to rethink traditional processes, integrate new technologies, and foster a culture where safety is not just a requirement, but a core value. Continuously looking ahead also to the possibility to introduce chartered safety engineer as to enhance the responsibility of professional involvement on safety compliance remain on the agenda. In the coming year, I look forward to building upon the foundation we have laid together. ### **Report on Technical Seminars**

During the reporting year, the Safety Specialist Committee (SSC) continued to advance its mission of promoting safety culture, technical excellence, and professional development within the construction and engineering industry. In response to ongoing occupational safety challenges and evolving industry practices, the Committee successfully organized 26 technical activities, comprising 15 seminars and webinars, 6 technical visits and 5 Competition-related activities.

The technical visits were arranged locally and outside Hong Kong to provide members with first-hand exposure to best practices in safety management, low-carbon initiatives, electrical systems, smart manufacturing, and regulatory enforcement. These visits enhanced participants' understanding of practical safety applications, operational risks, and innovative technologies, while facilitating professional exchange across different regions and sectors.

In parallel, the Committee delivered a comprehensive seminar and webinar programme covering a broad spectrum of occupational safety, health, and technical topics. Key focus areas included lifting and transportation safety, work-at-height hazards, powered mechanical equipment, fire safety, anchorage and structural safety, and the application of design-for-safety principles. Regulatory compliance and professional practice were also addressed through briefings on updated statutory requirements, international management systems, and sustainable and intelligent engineering solutions.

To respond to emerging industry trends, the Committee also incorporated forward-looking themes related to digitalization and advanced technologies, encouraging members to consider the future implications of innovation on safety, governance, and infrastructure systems. These activities supported continuous learning and reinforced the importance of integrating technology with robust safety management frameworks.

Collaboration remained a core element of the Committee's work. Many activities were jointly organized with government departments, professional institutions, and industry partners, strengthening cross-disciplinary engagement and reinforcing shared responsibility for improving safety performance. Such collaborative efforts enhanced the reach, relevance, and overall impact of the Committee's programmes.

Overall, the activities organized during the year demonstrated SSC's ongoing commitment to promoting safety awareness, professional competence, and industry collaboration. By effectively combining in-person technical visits with online learning platforms, the Committee ensured accessible, relevant, and timely knowledge sharing for a wide range of practitioners.

Looking ahead, the Safety Specialist Committee will continue to organize technical visits, seminars, and webinars with a strong focus on accident prevention, regulatory compliance, and safety-by-design principles. Through sustained collaboration and member engagement, the Committee remains dedicated to supporting a safer, more resilient, and more sustainable construction industry.

### **Report on Design of Safety Excellence Award**

This year marked the second consecutive year that the Safety Specialist Committee (SSC) organized the Design for Safety Excellence Award, reaffirming the Committee's commitment to promoting safety-by-design principles within the construction industry. The Award aims to enhance workplace safety and contribute to the reduction of injuries and fatalities by recognizing outstanding achievements in safety design and innovation.

Through this initiative, SSC seeks to cultivate a proactive safety culture that encourages continuous improvement and sets higher industry standards, supporting the long-term development of a safer and more sustainable built environment. The Award also serves as a platform to promote professional growth, collaboration, and shared responsibility among engineers and industry stakeholders. To reflect the diversity of projects and innovation within the industry, submissions this year were classified into four categories:

- Category 1: Mega Projects (total project sum  $\geq$  HK\$3 billion)
- Category 2: Major Projects (total project sum  $<$  HK\$3 billion)
- Category 3: RMAA Projects (Repair, Maintenance, Alteration and Addition)
- Category 4: Innovative Ideas (individual entries)

A distinguished panel of adjudicators comprising senior government officials, industry leaders, academics, and professional representatives was appointed to ensure a rigorous and impartial assessment process. The judging process was guided by four key criteria: scalable safety elements, design for safety, engineering elements, and integrated safety and design improvement, emphasizing both innovation and practical applicability.

The application period concluded on 13 February 2026. Following an initial assessment, the Organizing Committee shortlisted submissions and invited selected participants to deliver presentations on 4 March 2026, providing an opportunity to further demonstrate the depth and impact of their safety-driven designs.

The final results will be announced, and awards will be presented at the SSC Annual Dinner on 6 May 2026. Through this Award, the Committee continues to encourage excellence in safety design, foster industry collaboration, and inspire engineers to embed safety considerations from the earliest stages of project development.
